<p>Selection-Admission Test Objective</p>	<p>Both tests (written and oral) will focus on research theme pathways identified from among the topic areas covered by the SSD¹ chosen by the applicant at the time of submission of their application.</p> <p>The interview is also aimed at ascertaining the applicant's demonstration of adequate skills and proficiency in a foreign language, as specifically indicated by them in their application.</p> <p><i>If there are limitations imposed by the legislation aimed at contrasting the epidemiological emergency from SARS-COVID19, different ways of carrying out the tests may be envisaged.</i></p>

	<p>Interview</p> <p>on a research project</p> <p>54 to 90 points</p>	<p>The interview will last approximately 45 mins.</p> <p>Applicants are invited to prepare a presentation on a research project that is consistent with the specific curriculum and the corresponding SSD chosen by them and indicated, under penalty of exclusion, in the application form.</p> <p>Candidates would need to achieve a minimum grade of 54/90 in the interview in order to pass the oral test.</p> <p>Candidates' English language skills and proficiency will also be evaluated on this occasion.</p> <p>The interview may be conducted via "<i>teleconference</i>" for foreign applicants not residing in Italy or for Italian applicants where circumstances so warrant, which should be justified based on appropriate documentation. In such event, applicants must indicate their Skype address, to be used for the oral test and ensure the use of a webcam to allow for their identification by the Selection-Admissions Committee.</p>
